Ohio State's Rare Books & Manuscripts Library: Madison Good, of The Ohio State University's Thompson Library Special Collections, will discuss Margaret Armstrong's career, highlights of her work, and some of the Armstrong books held in Ohio State's special collections.

Margaret Armstrong was one of the most celebrated and prolific book cover designers of the late 19th and early 20th century, with more than 300 known designs published over her 40-year career. Although lauded during her lifetime, her work fell into obscurity after her death, and it has only been in the past 30 years that she has been rediscovered and recognized for her innovative contributions to the turn of the century publishing industry.
